Venture Crew 369 teaches their "Basic UNIX for Programmers" classes on AT&T 3B2 equipment while the intermediate classes are taught on NeXT machines. The Crew utilizes Sun equipment as NIS & NFS servers.

Our Web Page is served from a Sun SPARC 20 on an OC3 line.

NEC C&C Research Institution donated our program an Auspex NFS server.



With this new server we will be one of two places in the World that teaches the utilization of the Auspex Server. We have one of the four largest Auspex sites in Columbus: [Nationwide Enterprises, Symix Computer Systems, AT&T, and Venture Crew 369]

Several of our Sun Servers have 128MB of RAM and we have almost 50GB of disk storage.

As our program is geared towards the serious design and implementation of large scale computer networks, no Intel or Microsoft products are utilized.
